

Candle Care



Trim the wick to 1/4 inch before each burn to create a clean and stable burn



Never leave a burning candle unattended. Put it out before leaving the room



Keep the candle on a flat surface, away from drafts and flammable objects



When burning for the first time, allow the candle to burn between 3-4 hours to avoid tunnelling



Do not burn the candle for more than 4 hours at a time and do not touch the candle until it has completely cooled



Keep candles out of reach of children and pets

Wax Melt Care



Break wax melt up to fit your warmer/burner to avoid overflow. You can reuse the wax melt until the scent has faded, then remove wax residue and add a new melt



Place your melts in a melt approved wax warmer/burner and never add oil or water



Never leave a burner/warmer unattended. Turn it off/put it out before leaving the room



Always read the manufacturers guide from your wax burner to see how long it can burn for. This will vary depending on the burner/warmer



Keep your burner/warmer on a flat and stable surface and away from drafts and flammable objects



Keep candles out of reach of children and pets

Candle Care Guide

Direction of use: Remove from packaging and take the dust cover off. Make sure to clear the surface of any dust or debris. Place the candle on a flat, clear surface. Make sure to cut the wick to no higher than 5mm before every use and light

- Open flames can be dangerous. Do not leave unattended while in use and make sure to extinguish the flame before leaving it.
- Do not move the candle when in use as the glass can become very hot, especially during the last half of the candle.
- Trim the wick to ¼ of an inch before each use to prevent mushrooming and an unstable burn.
- If your candle starts to mushroom – extinguish the flame, wait for the candle to cool, cut the wick and relight.
- If your candle is tunnelling – Don't worry! The heat from the glass will eventually clean the glass as it burns through the candle. The lower the flame gets, the hotter the glass will be.
- Do not leave the flame lit for more than 4 hours at a time.
- Keep out of reach of children and pets.
- The size of the room is important in regards to the strength of the scent throw. the larger the room, the larger the candle will need to be to be able to fill the room. If you find that the scent throw is weak, try moving the candle to a smaller room.
- When not in use store your candles in a cool, dry place. Ideally away from light (e.g. a cupboard).
- Be careful when extinguishing your candle, it is best to use a candle snuffer (coming soon) or a candle dipping tool to submerge the wick in the wax. Blowing out the candle can cause hot wax to blow out at you.

Wax Melt Care Guide

Directions of use: Break melt to fit burner to prevent overflow. Place wax melts in a clean & empty oil burner or electric warmer bowl. Do not add any water or oil and use unscented tealights. When fragrance spent, allow the wax to cool & dispose of with household waste. Do not wash down the drain.

- Store your wax melts in a cool dry place. Ideally away from any light (e.g. a cupboard).
- Only use wax melts in approved tealight or electric warmers. make sure to read and follow all instructions before first use.
- The size of the room is important in regards to the strength of the scent throw. The larger the room, the more wax melts are needed.
- Do not over fill your warmers. know the limits of your wax warmers to prevent a hazardous spillage.
- Break the wax melts up to fit the size of your burner to prevent overflow.
- Select a burner that doesn't burn too hot. The hotter it burns, the quicker the wax melt will burn off its fragrance.
- if using a traditional oil burner: Do not leave a lit flame unattended and make sure to extinguish the flame before leaving.
- Keep out of reach of children and pets.
- Remove all packaging before use.
